Mseto project have succeeded to raise more over 5 million Vetiver slips and reached many farmers in Taita District, coast province and all over Kenya. In October 23rd 2008, our nursery was burnt down by our landlord to terminate our lease. which was to expire in December, 2009 and we have a case in court right now due to the burning of the Vetiver nursery (Malicious damage) so we are waiting for the judgment which the last witness will be at the dock on 27th October, 2010 the investigating officer who investigated the case.

In January 2009, Mseto Environmental Group got a tender to supply Vetiver Slips and Facilitation of the Tema Project in Wongonyi, Taita Hills which was funded by Community Development Trust Fund (C.D.T.F) and European Union E.U. We supplied around 400,000 Vetiver Slips.
